"Two staff members at Shriners Hospitals for Children -Portland were inspired to repurpose discarded material and put it to good use! They hoped that using the material in a new way would help reduce hospital costs and also help the environment - and it worked! Read more about the bags that are now being produced from the hospital's volunteer sewing committee, made with material that would otherwise be wasted."



I wrote about this new project in the last Nydian. The Hospital has asked for our help with a "re-purposing" project. They have bags of special fabric made from plastic that is used to cover

surgical instrument trays before surgery. This material is used once in a sterile environment, then sent to the landfill. (They are no longer accepted for recycling). We will be making Patient Personal Belongings Bags out of them.

The Sewing Committee asked for help on this project as we have a LOT of material to make into bags. What a great response to our call for help! I turned in 63 so far, and Jacque DeVore was so excited. They are already being used for patients' belongings. This is an on-going project, so we will continue to need your help filling the need. Let me know if you need materials, instructions or more information.

Strategic Planning / Membership

How many of you have wondered exactly what the Strategic Planning/Membership Committee actually does? The membership part is pretty self-explanatory, but what's a Strategic Plan?

First, let's do a brief recap of the accomplishments of our membership efforts. So far this term, Nydia has initiated 38 new princesses, affiliated one, and held three awesome Ceremonials. The committee has reduced the number of members that might have been lost due to non-paid dues, reviewed and updated the Queen's remit list, and worked with members in distress.

Strategic Planning is a process to improve our future, how we operate, and set a purpose and guideline to ensure the success of our Temple. Our Mission Statement was developed by the committee early on and set the groundwork for the rest of plan. (Our Mission Statement can be found on the last page of the Nydian under the officer contact information.) Clear and concise steps have been developed and written to make a permanent plan for recruiting, retaining, and restoring members. Some of the developments that have resulted from the work of this committee include an improved Mentor Program and the recently started Retention Fund to help with dues payments.

Meeting monthly, the members of this committee brainstorm ways to improve our temple efforts. Future tasks include formulating a plan for building better relationships with our Masonic family and more profitable ways to fundraise and support our charity.

The committee consists of a cross section of our membership. The elected officers are there along with newer members. Diverse viewpoints are necessary and welcomed. The committee is always looking for new ideas and your input would be welcome.

Banker's Corner

by Pr. Donna Gray At every Stated Session, as Pr. Banker, I read the "Banker's Report" informing the membership of Nydia's checking account balance, money market balance, and the value of Nydia's investments managed by UBS. Sometimes when reporting monies taken in, paid out, and balances I notice a lot of members' eyes glassing over. It's hard to follow the numbers, and I have yet to find a way to make it an interesting read.

While discussing the 2020 budget the question was asked "what interest rate does the investment account earn."

First, what is the make-up of the investment account? Funds have been invested in GNMA Bonds. GNMA, pronounced Ginnie Mae, is a government-owned corporation guaranteeing bonds backed by government home mortgages such as FHA or VA. The bonds pay out monthly interest. The GNMA bonds coupon rate held in the account ranges from 5% to 6%. Current yield averages up to 5%. GNMA bonds are considered low risk when comparing to other types of investments.

The interest and sometimes principal payouts are deposited to the money market account held within the investment. The interest on the money market is low at 0.065%. The balance in this account has accumulated enough to purchase additional GNMA Bonds, which yield a better return on the investment.

The investment account also owns shares in DWS GNMA mutual fund. The mutual fund has holdings in GNMA bonds, 5-year, and 10year Treasury Notes. Monthly dividends are paid out and deposited directly to Nydia's checking account.

When the investment account was first opened, it was the intent of the board to invest conservatively and generate a modest monthly income.



This year most of the music we are presenting has some tie to the time when Nydia Temple was founded. Here is a little bit about our most recent songs. If you missed our performances, I hope you might look for these songs on YouTube.

In December we went with an old standard - not from 1919 and encouraged all the ladies present to sing along with "White Christmas."

In 1919 it seems like there were three main things on everyone's mind. The soldiers returning home from WWI was amply represented in music with a variety of songs ranging from solemn to humorous, with songs such as "My Captain is Working for Me Now", "The World is Waiting for the Sunrise", and the one we sang: "How 'Ya Gonna Keep 'Em Down on the Farm".

Then there was the 19th Amendment: Women's Suffrage. There are literally no suffrage songs from that time that remain; maybe there weren't any popular suffrage songs at the time. It was suggested that there were none because the music industry was male dominated. However, I did find one song we could sing to represent this very important subject: "Sister Suffragette" from the movie *Mary Poppins.* The Chorus had a mini demonstration during session marching around with signs and "Votes for Women" sashes while singing this song. We gave one of the sashes to Queen Kathy.

The third thing on people's minds would have been the 18th Amendment: Prohibition. The Temperance Movement had been going on for decades, but it seems it was not popular with many people. Songs lamenting the impending lack of liquor are in great abundance, such as "When the Moon Shines on the Moonshine" and "What'll We Do on a Saturday Night When the Town Goes Dry".

Queen Kathy allowed the Chorus to present a little entertainment at the Queen's Appreciation Tea in the form of a prohibition song: "You Cannot Make Your Shimmy Shake on Tea". While singing we passed around a couple flasks (empty) to help lubricate our shimmies and some of us shook. It was not a stellar performance, (Jazz singers we are not.) but it was fun.




