The word nydia is of Latin origin meaning a safe place or nest.


Nydia is most famous as a literary character in Edward Bulwer-Lytton's novel "The Last Days of Pompeii".

Supreme Session

SUPREMENILE MINIREPORT:

Ladies of the Household,

Princess Royal and I will make our reports at our official visits and at the September Session of the Temple, but I wanted to share some information with you right now.

First, Nydia Temple was honored to have three new **Supreme Appointments**.

Congratulations to these hard working Past Queens:



- PQ Paulette Schlee Supreme American Flag Escort
- PQ Karri Frahler Supreme Canadian Flag Escort
- PQ Beverly Eiden Supreme Temple Banner Escort

As for Nydia Temple honors:

- We got a third place ribbon in our category for new members we had 16. The winner, Hatasu No.1 had 27.
- ▶ We got a third place for having 14 Birthday Parties at the Hospital. The first and second place winners each had 18.
- ▶ We were fifth in giving (\$36,690.82). The average was about \$7,500.
- We were second in number of pillowcases donated.
- ▼ We were first in lap robes!

Legislation quick overview:

- ⇒ We are now only required to own and maintain a minimum of 4 rituals. Princess Recorder is responsible for the rituals.
- ⇒ In extenuating circumstances and with the vote of the temple, a member may be initiated by obligation only.
- ⇒ Former Patients of Shriners Hospitals with or without a Masonic relationships may be eligible for proposal to membership.
- ⇒ A 4 member Convention Committee was added to standing committees.
- ⇒ Each temple now has 5 ladies of the household to be eligible to be delegates for Supreme Nile.

Dress Code Results

There was a ruling on Dress Code Announced at Supreme Nile. The following is a direct quote sent to all Queens by Supreme Queen Marsha Sowers.

"Please be aware the change made to the Supreme Temple Daughters of the Nile Protocol (2013 Revision) by the Directors at the Annual Board Meeting held in Omaha, Nebraska. This change was effective as the day enacted. The change was made after a survey poll was conducted in the Subordinate Temples, which voted 76 Approved and 60 Disapproved.

Therefore, PROTOCOL, Section 1. DRESS, A. Attire (Page P-1) now reads;

Formal pants and dressy pant suits may be acceptable attire at a **Subordinate Temple Stated Session** that does not include a Ceremonial for members not participating in the Ritualistic

Ceremonies of the Order.

Please note the words "may be". The Board of Directors recognizes that your Temple may have certain customs and traditions that they wish to retain. It also realizes that not all Temple members will want to wear dressy pants or pant suits to your Stated Session. So, you now have the option of wearing dressy pants or pant suits or continuing with your Temple tradition of wearing dresses or skirts to your Sessions. Such a decision should be made for your Temple by a vote of the Temple."

Ladies of the Household....Supreme Protocol has always given us the right to allow this for those ladies who find it difficult to wear a dress to sessions because of illness or advanced age...that has not changed and no lady is going to be turned away because she is not wearing a dress. However, some things to consider...the wearing of dressy slacks or pant suits is **NOT** an option during ceremonial. The temple has some spare skirts that can be worn. We also must remember that if each temple has its own rules and one temple says yes to pants and another says no, that leaves our visitors open to embarrassment...so, to be on the safe side, I would always wear a dress to visit another temple session. Also, this ruling DOES NOT APPLY TO THOSE WHO ARE A PART OF RITUALISTIC CEREMONIES. That means, officers still are required to wear floor length formals to sessions.

Because the Supreme Queen has asked us to have a vote of the temple...there will be a ballot at the September session. It will have several options and there will not be any discussion during the session. I am including the options here and if you have any questions or comments, please contact me directly at starmason@aol.com or 503-550-5882.

OPTIONS:

1. Follow the PROTOCOL, Section 1. Dress, A Attired (Page p-1) as it now reads:

Formal pants and dressy pant suits may be acceptable attire at a **Subordinate Temple Stated Session** that does not include a Ceremonial for members not participating in the Ritualistic Ceremonies of the Order.

2. Follow the PROTOCOL, Section 1. Dress, A Attired (Page p-1) with the following underlined addition.

Formal pants and dressy pant suits may be acceptable attire at a **Subordinate Temple Stated Session** that does not include a Ceremonial for members not participating in the Ritualistic Ceremonies of the Order. <u>The Queen may choose to request that no slacks or pants suits be worn at specific sessions</u>. For example, request that during the <u>December and March sessions the Ladies of the Household be asked to dress up specifically for Christmas and the Queens Tea.</u>

3. Ignore the change to PROTOCOL, Section 1. Dress, A Attired (Page p-1)

Continue as before the change

Lastly, no matter what the vote, if at any time you feel a lady is not appropriately dressed to attend session, <u>please</u> do not talk to her directly...come to me and let me handle the situation. All Ladies of the Household deserve that courtesy.

In May we only had 5 children, but served 18 adults. In June we had 14 children and 18 adults.




