## Session Notes

The May luncheon, served by Vancouver Nile Club to 49 Ladies of the Household, consisted of croissant sandwiches, salads, and strawberry shortcake for dessert. Yum!

May was Queen Sharon's second Session, and there were three Past Supreme Queens present: PSQ Muriel Knapp, PSQ Karen Mentzer, and PSQ Suzie Schumacher—not to mention past & reigning queens, Supreme Appointees, and a candidate for Supreme Badoura: PQ Vivian Gould. Everyone was a tiny bit nervous over the dignitaries present, but all performed their parts well.

Most of the business consisted of reports from committees, the annual philanthropic report, and preparations for Supreme Session. The Sewing Committee reported 275 hours and total production of 73 items in April. They are raffling off a "Big Cat" quilt. The Hospital volunteers reported 10 hrs. for the drivers and 96.75 for clerical. Clerical hours are more than usual because they hadn't been including one of our ladies. Pr. Patty Baldwin reported that the Membership Committee was at the Shriner's Ceremonial with some positive results. The Philanthropic report for last year had a total of \$10,645.74.

The PADIR asked and was granted permission to perform at NW Daze. There had been an Obligation-only Initiation Ceremony in Bend in April. PQ Judy proposed that Chorus should have funds to purchase new music; this was voted on and approved.

In the middle of all this, the "Aswan Dam broke" when most of a bottle of water spilled on the stage, causing a short break in the proceedings. Despite the flood, the meeting went well, and when the Past Supreme Queens spoke, they all had nice things to say about Nydia Temple.

## Hospital Highlights

This November 7th Shriners Hospitals for Children in Portland will be receiving a third gold plaque from the Daughters of the Nile Foundation. Each gold plaque represents a million dollar donation to the hospital from the Daughters of the Nile Foundation, so this third plaque means \$3 million dollars has been donated to the Portland Hospital by the Daughters of the Nile Foundation. There is a huge donors wall in the lobby of the hospital, and this is where our newest plaque will be placed.

Not only is our Portland Hospital getting a plaque, the Shriners Hospital in Hawaii will also receive a gold plaque next February.

The Daughters of the Nile, since the beginning of our organization, has contributed over \$56 million dollars to the entire hospital system. That's just money; it does not include all the items made or given, like school room supplies, sewing, etc., or the time spent, like putting on birthday parties, clerical support, driving, etc. The Daughters of the Nile are the number one contributors to the hospitals, after the Shriners themselves – an accomplishment of which we are very proud.

**Did you know.....**While the main emphasis of the hospitals is to provide medical care to children regardless of the family's ability to pay, the mission of the hospitals also includes research on the conditions treated and the education of medical professionals.

There are seven research facilities located in Shriners Hospitals. The Portland Research Center occupies part of the 6th floor. It has seven scientists and a total staff of around 50. It is closely affiliated with OHSU. Their focus of study is musculoskeletal development.

### Remember to save ....

Nydia temple collects Toiletries and Box Tops for Education for the hospital. Please count these items and put them in a plastic bag with your name and the number so that we can record them for credit each year with Supreme.

The Campbell's Soup labels program has been discontinued, effective Aug 1st. Thank you for all the past clipping, counting and saving!

Walmart Cards are always needed for the Honolulu Hospital for sewing supplies. Please mark them with your name/club and amount.
