# The Nydia White Rose



Ladies of the Household, in each Nile year we experience the loss of a Princess and many times are requested to participate in her final services with our White Rose Ceremony. So that you all may be aware of its tradition, I present the following for your information:

This moving ceremony is unique to Nydia Temple. Every Princess is entitled to have this performed, and every Princess is invited to participate whenever it is presented. Other Temples use the funeral ceremony provided in the ritual. We simply place a single white rose on a small table; often there is a picture of the departed Princess honored, and to identify our order, the Nile Emblem is also present. All Princesses in attendance file past with a pause and a nod to acknowledge our love and respect for the beloved member. The ceremony is so very simple and impressive.

The White Rose Committee tries to contact all Ladies of the Household with the information of who, when, and where so that all may participate. We are asked to arrive a little early in a navy blue suit with a white blouse. A white rose corsage and white gloves are provided by the committee to those participating. Please feel free to attend and take part even if you are not in navy and white.

I do not know the history or why this tradition was started, only that Nydia Temple has shown this special acknowledgment to every princess who expressed a wish to her family to have it included in her final services. The ceremony has been in use for many years, and we wish all of the Ladies of the Household to be familiar with it, and to attend a ceremony when possible.

To be eligible for its use a Princess must have been a current member.

Did You Know...?

Did you know Pediatric Orthotics and Prosthetics Services at the Portland Shriners
Hospital produces devices for more than the Portland Hospital? The POPS Northwest,
LLC., located within the Portland hospital also supports the Spokane, Chicago and St.
Louis Shriners Hospitals. With the use of the CAD-CAM (computer aided design-computer aided manufacturing) system, technicians elsewhere e-mail scans to Portland which are carved on a foam form, becoming a mold to build the orthotic or prosthetic device. This takes only about 30 minutes. Then a technician here builds a device and mails it back, sometimes in as little as the same day. sometimes in as little as the same day.

# Nydia Temple No. 4 Sewing Info

Most of our ladies know that we are noted for the beautiful items hand-made for our local Shriners Hospital for Children here in Portland. There are many ways for our members to participate in this endeavor, even for some who don't actually sew.

Members of the Nydia Temple Sewing Committee work at the hospital every Tuesday. They design and create beautiful Transition Quilts for graduating patients; lap quilts and matching pillow cases for in-patients' beds; shorts for the gait lab, radiology, and outpatient clinics; bags for walkers and wheelchairs; bean bags for Child Life, and many other projects.

To be a member of this committee, you MUST be a Daughter of the Nile. The Sewing Committee is considered a Temple Committee, just like the Budget Committee or Ways and Means. If you'd like to visit and see the committee in action, contact the chairman Pr. Sherry Hevland.

Once a lady is asked to be on the Sewing Committee, she has to go through the entire volunteer process with the hospital. This includes blood and TB tests, medical records, HIPAA training, and Volunteer Orientation. No one can work at the hospital without fulfilling all of these requirements. The process can take several weeks to complete.

There are sewing groups that meet outside the hospital. Some meet at area Nile Clubs such as Tirzah Club, Salem Nile Club, Beth-Eden Nile Club and others.

Many ladies contribute embroidered quilt blocks and other items that they complete at home. If this is something that appeals to you, there is always a need.

If you just can't sew or it just doesn't interest you, there is always a need for fabric, notions, and batting. Those Wal-Mart gift cards for the Shriners Hospitals in Hawaii and Mexico are wonderful contributions, too.


## Nite Lites Nile Club

# FUN FACTS FROM WAY BACK

Nydia Temple was presented its charter on April 24, 1919, becoming the fourth Temple of the newly formed Daughters of the Nile organization which began in 1913. Back in those days, and for many years to follow, articles in the "women's section" of the local newspapers printed sometimes large and sometimes small articles about Nydia Temple. With the help of Noble John Smith, historian for Al Kader Shriners and a retired librarian, and PQ Paulette Schlee, Princess Recorder, we will be sharing these fun facts from way back. #### :Article from the Oregonian Newspaper on April 11, 1921:

# "Nydia Temple Initiates" "Class of 138 of New Members Admitted to Lodge" "Daughters of the Nile Officers Give Luncheon at Imperial Hotel for Candidates"

In a ceremonial held on the second anniversary of the organization Nydia Temple No. 4, Daughters of the Nile, 138 new members drawn from Portland and all parts of Oregon were added to the order Saturday afternoon at Pythian Hall.

Announcement was made following the ceremony that Nydia Temple will be hostess to the Supreme Temple, Daughters of the Nile, May 26-28, with delegates from all parts of the country in attendance.

The class was one of the largest ever admitted into Nydia Temple. With its admission, the membership of the local temple reached approximately 900 members. Mrs.

Henrietta Boyd, Queen of Nydia Temple, presided over the ceremony.

Following the initiation, the temple patrol put on a number of stunts for the benefit of the new members. Ms. Barge E. Leonard was presented in an accordion solo. The Nydia Temple quartet assisted throughout the ceremony with vocal selections. The quartet, under the direction of Mrs. A. E. Davidson, is composed of Mrs. C. H. Henry, Mrs. J. B. Ettinger, Mrs. J. B. Keefer and Mrs. W. R. Kaser.

The candidates were entertained by the officers of the temple at a luncheon the Imperial Hotel before the initiations.

All of our officers did a lovely job at putting on a beautiful Ceremonial. At the November Session, PQ Judy, as Ceremonial Assistant, said our Ceremonial was outstanding. Several of our ladies went with the Supreme Queen to her next OV in Yakima. Four of our ladies filled-in at their ceremonial, doing the parts from memory. They did Nydia proud.

The November Session started with a lunch of turkey and dressing. Then we were visited by some 99 year old ladies trying to get to NW Daze next August!

Session opened in short form, with Queen Reba back on the throne.

There were four proposals read, and eight balloted on. Pr. Recorder has three petitions for initiation.

The Chorus sang "Turkey in the Pan" then "This Land is Your Land" with many of the ladies joining in.

The Birthday Party Committee reported that the Supreme Queen was at the October party along with 13 children and 23 adults. There were two new clowns: Klem and Sea Weed. (And it was discovered that Supreme Queen Shirley is a clown too - Freckles!)

There was a thank you letter from patient Beca Mobley. The Sewing Committee's Sherry Hevland filled in the rest of the story. Beca was West Queen and is Grand Worthy Advisor for Rainbow. They made an extra special personalized quilt for her as she transitions out of the Shriner's system.

Sherry also talked about how beanie babies are the ONLY stuffed animals allowed at the hospital and are used for comfort for surgery patients.


