

Session Notes

In August there was a special session just for membership purposes—reading proposals, petitions, and balloting—and for discussing the Supreme Queen's visit. There were 26 members in attendance including PSQ Mavis from Lincoln, Nebraska. There were 12 proposals read and 6 ladies balloted upon. The meeting was very short.

September 3 was our first regular Stated Session after Supreme and the summer break. In keeping with the Back to School theme, the PADIR served brown bag lunches filled with delicious croissant sandwiches, fruit, chips, carrot sticks, a cookie, and snack size candy bars. After the lunch Queen Laurie honored the units with a small gift, and Princess Royal gave her Supreme report.

During Session, 5 Supreme Appointees were introduced and Queen Laurie gave her report with the results of the Supreme Legislation (see pg. 18) and announced the awards that Nydia Temple received (see Nydia Brag Box pg. 10).

Pr. Recorder read the minutes and 4 months worth of bills! Pr. Banker gave a summary report. Four proposals were read and 12 ladies were balloted on. Salem and 3 Sisters Nile Clubs had new by-laws approved.

Permissions were given for the Sewing Committee to raffle two quilts (see ad pg. 15), Forest Nile Club to sell dolls at the October and November sessions, and PADIR to have a fashion show as part of the Kick-off luncheon on June 1, 2016. Pr. Royal Sharon announced her Supreme Queen's OV as Saturday November 5, 2016, and reminded us of the upcoming wreath and basked auction at the December Session (see pg. 17).

The donation of new ceremonial gowns was announced. They will be used at the upcoming ceremonial.

There is a new program from Supreme called Ceremonial Assistance. It takes a year of hard work to complete. Our PQ Paulette completed this process and Queen Laurie gave her certificate to her.

For her year, Queen Laurie has said that she wants Nydia Temple to work more with the Shriners. They have asked for assistance for two of their events. One is the MDA walk on 9/13 and the other is at the October Fest at Mt. Angel Sept 17-20. There will probably be more opportunities to help out as the year progresses. Any volunteers to assist the Shriners will be appreciated.

Although this session was of necessity longer than usual, Queen Laurie does a good job of keeping it moving along. It is very interesting to hear the reports from the committees, announcements, correspondence, and all the other bits that cannot be included here. Stated Session is where the business of the Temple gets done, and it cannot get done without us. Everyone is encouraged to attend as often as your other duties permit. Hope to see you there!

Hospital Support Club

Al Kadar Shriners have started a new club, the "Hospital Support Club" with the intention of promoting the Portland Hospital. The club is open to any "friend of Shriners" who wishes to help in promoting the Hospital. There are two different components to the club:

First, they have an eighteen-foot trailer (float) that can be used in local parades. There are twelve chairs on the float which they have filled with patients and their families and "friends of Shriners" who can't walk the entire parade. They also encourage out-walkers who walk along with the float and interact with the crowd.





This summer the out-walkers handed out seed packets that had information about the hospital on the back. During 2015 the float was used in the Portland Starlight Parade, also in Sheridan, Tillamook, Newberg, and Baker City.

Second, they have established a Speaker's Bureau consisting of a cadre of people who are willing to speak for the hospital at public events such as health fairs. The hospital staff is planning some training for the Speaker's Bureau members in the near future.



SUPREME TEMPLE DAUGHERS OF THE NILE LEGISLATION RESULTS

SUPREME TEMPLE ANNUAL SESSION 2015

ALBUQUERQUE, NEW MEXICO

1. Please be aware of the changes made to the Supreme Temple Bylaws (2013 Revision) by the voting Delegates at the Supreme Temple Ninety-ninth Annual Supreme Session in Albuquerque, New Mexico. These changes were effective as of the day enacted.

Amendment A-1 to PART 1, ARTICLE III, SECTION 5, SUPREME PRINCESS RECORDER'S ALLOCATION, ASSISTANTS AND TERM LIMIT: (B) EXECUTIVE ASSISTANTS 1. PAGE 33 which increases the stipend of the Office Assistant to the Supreme Princess Recorder 1. "seven hundred dollars (US \$750) per month." With PROVISO—Retro-active to may 1, 2015 was ADOPTED

Amendment A-3 to PART II, ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP, SECTION 1 ELIGIBILITY (a) PAGE 56 which would have expanded membership eligibility to include "or who is or was a volunteer, with or without Shrine or Masonic relationship as a Shriners Hospital for Children or Masonic related health facility" was **DEFEATED**

Amendment A-4 to **PART II, ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP, SECTION 1 ELIGIBILITY (a) PAGE 56** which would have expanded membership eligibility to include (a) "Eligibility to membership in a Temple shall be open to a woman of good character who is eighteen years of age or older with or without Shrine or Masonic relationship. (b) "An eligible woman shall be proposed by two(2) members in Good Standing who are acquainted with and will vouch for the woman. The proposal for membership shall be signed and submitted to the Princess Recorder" was **DEFEATED**

Amendment A-5 **PART II, ARTICLE II SECTION 13. DUAL MEMBERSHIP, PAGE 58** amend by adding Section 13 Dual Membership. "A member may belong to two (2) Subordinate Temples at the same time. She shall have the privilege of making motions and voting in both Temples" was **ADOPTED**

Amendment A-6 PART II, ARTICLE IV, OFFICIAL TEMPLE PROPERTIES, SECTION 3, SUPREME BYLAWS, PROTOCOL AND MANUAL OF PROCEDURES, PAGE 62-63 amend by substituting Section 3 "Each Subordinate Temple shall own six (6) copies of the Supreme Temple Bylaws, Protocol and Manual of Procedures, to be issued to the Queen, Princesses Royal, Tirzah, Badoura, Recorder, and Banker. These books shall remain the property of the Temple" was **ADOPTED**

Amendment A-7 PART II, ARTICLE V, SECTION 4, ELECTION OF OFFICERS (c) PAGE 64 amend by adding Section 4(c) "and shall include only names nominated from the floor." was ADOPTED

Amendment A-8 PART II, ARTICLE VII, SECTION 2, CEREMONIALS (a) AND (b) PAGE 73 amend by substituting Section 2

- (a) "Each Temple shall hold at least one (1) Ceremonial annually at the time of the Official Visit of the Supreme Queen. The Temple Officers shall exemplify the Amplified Opening initiation and Closing from the Ritual.
- (b) The Queen may elect to hold additional Ceremonials, if there are candidates" was ADOPTED
