ATTENDANCE:

Registration fees were \$95 and covered 5 meals, all seminars, and special events such as the Dilly Dilly Degree. Tours, T-Shirts, and Raffle tickets were the only extra expenses. The hospitality area had donated food snacks available all day long. We did allow some to register for the Saturday evening formal banquet only, at a cost of \$35. All meals were buffet with the exception of the formal banquet which was a served Prime Rib and Shrimp Dinner. All who attended the banquet received an acrylic Raindrop Ornament as a favor and souvenir of the weekend.

Twenty temples were represented for a total registration of 164 in attendance (11 of those only paid and attended the formal banquet) – 25 men were in attendance. 160 attended the Formal banquet and we comped 8 guests. Temples registered: Numbers 1, 2, 4, 5, 6, 12, 13, 17, 40, 54, 62, 76, 79, 92, 100, 103, 104, 115, 157, and 158. The largest attendance was Nydia with 62 registered. Areas represented were: Oregon, Washington, California, Idaho, Ohio, Minnesota, Florida, Montana, Texas, Alberta, and British Columbia.

FUN FACTS FROM WAY BACK

Nydia Temple was presented its charter on April 24, 1919, becoming the fourth Temple of the newly formed Daughters of the Nile organization which began in 1913. Back in those days, and for many years to follow, articles in the "women's section" of the local newspapers printed sometimes large and sometimes small articles about Nydia Temple. With the help of Noble John Smith, historian for Al Kader Shriners and a retired librarian, and PQ Paulette Schlee, Princess Recorder, we will be sharing these fun facts from way back. Enjoy, Queen Kathy Walliker.

Article from the Sunday Oregonian, October 20, 1969:

The Golden Anniversary celebration of Nydia Temple No. 4, Daughters of the Nile, will attract high level officers from throughout the United States to a Saturday, October 25, ceremonial and banquet.

Heading this group will be the supreme queen of the supreme temple, Mrs. William S. Fisher, Rochester, N.Y.

Mrs. Louis F. Larsen, queen of Nydia Temple, will preside over the 1 p.m. ceremonial at the Masonic Temple with a large class of candidates from throughout Oregon to be initiated.

A 7 p.m. banquet at the Hilton Hotel is being arranged by Mrs. Scott H. Waters, chairman, for approximately 900 persons.

Among guests will be nine past supreme queens, three of them

from Oregon, and four current supreme officers in addition to Mrs. Fisher. Also included will be 14 reigning queens and more than 40 past queens from subordinate temples in the United States and Canada.

Nydia Temple 50 year members will be given a special tribute along with new initiates.

Mrs. Arthur Armstrong is in charge of banquet entertainment which will feature songs by the temple chorus and a dance review by Nydia Temple dancers as well as a performance by Bruce Kelly's "Mello-macs."

Historical picture, gowns and dolls dressed in replicas of Queen's installation attire will be among displays planned for the anniversary. Mrs. Homer Parrish, past queen, is general chairman.

Nydia Temple to Note Golden Anniversary

A "once in 50 years" event is being planned by Nydia Temple No. 4, Daughters of the Nile, in commemoration of its golden anniversary on Saturday, October 25.

A ceremony and banquet will also honor Mrs. Dorothy S. Fisher, Rochester, N.Y. Supreme Queen of the Supreme Temple.

Visiting dignitaries from 17 other temples in the United States and Canada will attend the festivities of Nydia Temple, the largest subordinate Temple with a membership of 4,211.

The ceremonial is planned for 1 p.m. in the Shrine Ballroom of the Masonic Temple, 1119 SW Park Ave., with the banquet set for 7 p.m. at the Hilton Hotel.

Mrs. Scott H. Waters, Princess Badoura, is chairman of

arrangements for the banquet with plans made for 900 persons.

Mrs. Leib L. Riggs, Past Queen, is chairman of the "Golden Memory" display of historical pictures, Past Queens' installation gowns, dolls dressed in replicas of installation attire and other mementos covering the 50 year span of Temple (unreadable).

Because of the scope of the anniversary event, Mrs. Louis F. Larsen, Nydia Queen, and Mrs. Louis Lang, Past Queen and project chairman, have suggested members give a voluntary contribution to Nydia's philanthropic project in lieu of a fund raising event.

Proceeds will be sent to the Supreme Convalescent Relief Fund to purchase prosthetic equipment for outpatients, crippled children of the Shriners Hospitals.
