Legislation results are as follows: I won't elaborate too much. LV-2 All membership vote. Linda Hatch and I fought for this one, but it failed.

LV-17 Registration for Supreme Session cost \$80 change to \$125. Failed.

LV-19 Membership. Eligibility to be open to our previous eligibility requirements and includes a close of trusted friend of a Daughter of the Nile and whose desire is to advance the philanthropy of DoN. Passed

LV-20 Invitation for membership may be sent within ten days and may be sent electronically. Passed.

LV-21 Dispensation for installation out of time not needed. Passed.

LV-22 Full amplified form of stated session for Founders' Day. Passed. May exemplify Amplified Opening, Initiation, and Closing from the Ritual at Ceremonials. Passed

Most of the amendments were pretty straight-forward and were largely housekeeping corrections. If you wish to review the legislation more fully, it is available on the C-Vent app or you can borrow one for review.

# Hospital Happenings

Yesterday, in the mail I received the Shriners Children's Impact Report for 2024. The report is showing Shriners Children's has 13 hospitals located throughout the United States including one in Canada and one in Mexico along with 12 outpatient care medical centers. Each hospital is unique with its own building theme and décor. Each hospital has its own specialties ranging from orthopedic conditions, burn care, cleft lip and palate and spinal cord injury. Care is provided regardless of the families' ability to pay or insurance status.

During 2024 there were 217,615 clinical procedures; 24,492 life changing surgeries; 446,799 rehab procedures and 18,765 telehealth encounters. The children came from 50 states and 128 countries.

Shriners Children's has spent the last ten years improving treatment for scoliosis developing the MAGEC (Magnetic Expansion Control) Spinal Bracing and Distraction System. Instead of numerous surgeries to update the growing rods the MAGEC system is a single implantation surgery followed by non-invasive adjustment using external remote control that leverages magnets to lengthen the rods. This last year there were 18 locations, including Portland offering the MAGEC System technology. There were 1,461 spinal surgeries or procedures in 2024 and 87 MAGEC System procedures in 2024.

This year Queen Holly asked me to be the Hospital Liaison. Let me know if there is a Shriners Children's Portland subject you would like me to address in the next Nydian.


# Nydia Temple Hospital Requests/Sewing Committee August 2025

There was also a request for additional drain covers and a few specialty items. And it's always fun to see the mannequins we made on their way to "work" with staff for training purposes. 
